# **PRESS RELEASE**

New Races added in the 40<sup>th</sup> National Canoe Sprint Championships 2017 to develop our Young Paddlers and the Para-canoeing Community into Champions

**Singapore**, **1 June 2017** – Singapore Canoe Federation\* (SCF) will be holding their 40<sup>th</sup> National Canoe Sprint Championships\* (NCC) on 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> May 2017 at MacRitchie Reservoir.

The Guest of Honour for the NCC is Mr Darryl David, Member of Parliament for Ang Mo Kio GRC, Deputy Chairperson, Government Parliamentary Committee for Culture, Community and Youth, accompanied by the SCF Adviser, Mr Desmond Lee, Minister, Prime Minister's Office, Second Minister for Home Affairs, Second Minister for National Development, and Deputy Leader of the House.

Mr Darryl David will be flagging off the inaugural Junior Kayak Singles (JK1) 2,000m event for kids aged 12 and under at 4.00pm. This challenging event, introduced to further junior development on the advice of National Kayak Coach Balázs Babella, a former two-time world champion who started paddling before the age of 12, will see some of the youngest paddlers in the NCC pit themselves against one another in a test of skill, endurance and strategy.

In this year's NCC, to promote and champion active participation for athletes with disabilities, a new event was added – Paracanoe Kayak Singles (K1) 200m. This event is scheduled at 5pm where 6 of our paracanoe paddlers will be participating for the very first time – using canoeing as a therapeutic activity, under the Canoe Care initiative.

Said Mr Yip, "We hope to further develop and promote the growth of Canoeing in Singapore. So as to achieve our vision of making Canoeing an inclusive and excellent Sport for all in Singapore."

The NCC first started in 1977 and this year's NCC2017 marks the 40<sup>th</sup> year.

- Number of participants: 400\*, mainly youths aged 13 23 years old

- Number of KIAK athletes participating: 20+, aged 8 12 years old
- Number of para-canoe athletes participating: 6 (1st time participating in NCC)
