# 4. REVIEW OF FINANCIAL STATE AND EXPLANATION OF MAJOR FINANCIAL TRANSACTIONS


#### 4.1. Funding Sources

The Federation's source of funding includes boat storage fees, course fees, events registration fee, sponsorship, membership fee, government grants and donations.


### 4.2. Financial Highlight

- a. During the year, the Federation recorded expenditure of \$2,598,307. The total income was \$2,582,116, which included grants received from the Sport Singapore of \$1,511,288 and the remaining were the operating income of \$1,070,828. The deficit was \$16,191.
- b. The Secretariat ensured that funds were utilised for its intended purposes and half-yearly reports were provided to Sport Singapore.
- c. Kong, Lim & Partners LLP was responsible for auditing SCF's account for Financial Year 2018/2019. As at 31<sup>st</sup> March 2019, the Federation was in a favourable position with accumulated funds totalling \$835,797.

#### b. Sharing Session with Mr Martin Marinov

SCF was very honoured to have Mr Martin Marinov, International Canoe Federation (ICF) Technical Manager for Canoe Sprint / Calm water to share his journey on becoming an Olympian as well as preparation and training requirements of international level paddlers. Mr Marinov is a 5-time Olympian with 48 years of canoeing experience under his belt. On 12<sup>th</sup> January 2019, over 80 participants attended the sharing session with Mr Martin Marinov.

#### c. Waterway Clean-Up at Marina Reservoir

The Marina Reservoir is considered the Federation's second home. On 2<sup>nd</sup> February 2019, the national athletes carried out the tradition to keep the waterways of Marina Reservoir clean and sparkly. It is greatly appreciated that SCF Advisor, Mr. Desmond Lee, PUB, NParks, International Coastal Clean-up SG, Otter Working Group, PA Water Venture and the training partners from Hungary were present to join in this tradition.

# XXXVII International Canoe Federation (ICF) Ordinary Congress

The biennial Congress was held from 23<sup>rd</sup> to 24<sup>th</sup> November 2018 in Budapest, Hungary. A total of 68 National Federations (NF) were represented at the Congress. Mr Yip Kwan Guan, SCF President and Dr Zason Chian, Vice President attended the Congress. The main theme of the Congress revolved around the topic of innovation towards the future growth of the sport.

Mr. Jose Perurena Lopez, ICF President highlighted about the future challenges faced by our sport, especially its inclusion in future Olympic Games. There is a continual stream of new sports (e.g. climbing) that are gaining wide popularity and making their way as Olympic events.

In order to remain as an Olympic event, he shared some strategies such as staying visible especially through mass media such as television programmes and social media, and consolidating venues for different disciplines to achieve cost effectiveness in the organisation of major events. Closer relationships with athletes to better cater to their needs so that they will stay on the sport and continue supporting the sport even after their competitive years.

A group of seven pioneer kayak coaches overcame the challenge of crossing the Marina Barrage from Marina Reservoir to the sea off East Coast beach. The objective of the event is to provide opportunities for young paddlers (aged 12 years old and below) to compete at the national level in the discipline of Canoe Sprint and encourage participation and further development of young paddlers in Canoe Sprint.

#### 18. HUMAN RESOURCE & ADMINISTRATIVE

#### 18.1. Info-tech Integrated HR Software

#### 20.1. The Priorities for Financial Year 2019/2020

- a. Building up business capabilities through managing workforce planning effectively, streamlining and modernising operations, increasing revenue and improving profitability. SCF aims to achieve strong organisation culture that includes reinforcing the Federation's core values, reviewing organisation structure, having management support, implementing performance and recognition system, improving communication and investing in learning and training. Action plans include:
  - Review all policies and ensure to maintain a complete set of policies and procedures
  - Set up the 2<sup>nd</sup> phrase of the website (customers, affiliates, membership, courses, events and other functionalities)
  - Implementation of IT and cashless system to achieve seamless operation
  - Secure more sponsors in terms of cash and value in kind
  - Setting up of the Canoe Academy with ActiveSG
- b. Focus on High Performance Canoe Sprint, target to achieve medals in 2019 SEA Games and to qualify for 2020 Olympic Games continental qualifier with focus on the development and implementation of the athlete pathway map. Action plans include:
  - Increase the level of support and involvement of sport science
  - More local training camps and involvement of training partners
  - Renewal of current fleet of boats
  - Increase participants in the National Junior Development Squad
  - Setting up the Youth Development system
  - Complete the development of SG Coach Level 1 Integrated programme
  - Adoption and implementation of Safe Sport policy
